# LAUNCH OF THE CHILD PROTECTION TRAINING WORKSHOP AND CHILD ABUSE WORKBOOK

**Port-of-Spain:** On Tuesday 15<sup>th</sup> May, 2018, the Office of the Prime Minister in collaboration with the Ministry of Education and UNICEF launched its Child Protection Training Workshop and Child Abuse Workbook at the Couva West Secondary School. This training is an integral aspect of the overall child abuse awareness campaign and long term strategy to empower officers attached to the Student Support Services Division within the Ministry of Education. The objectives of the workshop are:

- To increase officers awareness of child abuse;
- To provide training on the appropriate procedures to be used in the prevention of child abuse;
- To teach stakeholders prevention and protection protocol; and
- To contribute to raising public awareness of child abuse;

The launch commenced with welcome remarks from Mr. Bertrand Moses, Coordinator Child Development, Office of the Prime Minister (Gender and Child Affairs) and the Honourable Ayanna Webster – Roy, Minister of State in the Office of the Prime Minister. The Honourable Dr. Lovell Francis, Minister of State in the Ministry of Education delivered the feature address.

Minister Webster- Roy shared the experiences that shaped her youth and the valuable impact that her Guidance Officers had on her growth and development. She encouraged participants to utilize the acronym act **FAST** which means **F**: tell a trusted family member; **A**: contact the Children's Authority or police; **S**: seek help from Student Support Services Officers attached to your school and **T**: telephone the child protection hotline at 996 or 131.

In his address, Minister Francis emphasized that the approach to protecting children is not an all of Government approach but it is all of society working together to protect children. Each person has the responsibility to save a life. He further reminded officers that they are aptly positioned to shape the universe of a child under their care and protection.

After the addresses, Minister Webster –Roy symbolically launched the Child Abuse Workbook by presenting it to Angelie Ramcharitar, a student of the Couva West Secondary School. The Workbook is an anti-child abuse booklet which seeks to educate children on types of child abuse
